


THE CATHOLIC'S ATTEMPT TO CHANGE GOD'S LAW



THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

I

I am the Lord thy God. Thou shalt not have no other gods before Me

Thou shalt not commit adultery

**read carefully the differences between the
two Ten Commandments.**

The first is the law as it was written by God and given to the world; the second is the law as changed by the Catholic Church.

You can see that the second commandment that forbids idol making and worship has been completely removed in the Catholic version of the law, and to make up for the shortfall they have taken the tenth clause in the law of God and have split it in two separate laws thus making back ten clauses.

Also, you would observe that the fourth clause in God's law is now the third clause in the Catholic version, and it is so ambiguously worded that we would not know which day is the Sabbath of Yhwh.

This was done by the Church in order to hide the fact that it is the seventh day (known today as Saturday) and not Sunday, the first day of the week, that ought to be kept as the Sabbath day as imperatively required by God by all men.

But then the Roman Catholic Church is bold and defiant enough before God to declare that they have changed God's law. God said:

“The works of His hands are verity and judgement; all His commandments are sure. They stand fast forever and ever....”

Ps 111:7,8. "Think not that I have come to destroy the law or the prophet:I am not come to destroy but to fulfil. For verily I say unto you, till heaven and earth pass, not one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law till all be fulfilled." Matt 5:17,18.

But the Roman Catholic Church says:

"The Church is above the Bible, and this transference of Sabbath observance is proof of that fact," The Catholic Record of London, Ontario, Canada, Sept. 1, 1923.

"Of course the Catholic Church claims that the change of the Sabbath was her act....." Letter from the Cardinal Gibbon's office, Oct. 28, 1895. By C.F. Thomas Chancellor.

"Had she [the Church] not such power, she could not have done that in which all modern religionists agree with her- she could not have substituted the observance of Sunday, the first day of the week, for the observance of Saturday, the seventh day, a change for which there is no scriptural authority," A Doctrinal Catechism, by Stephen Keenan, pg. 174.

"All things whatsoever that it was duty to do on the Sabbath, these were transferred to the Lord's day." Commentary on the Psalms, by Eusebius.

"It was the Catholic Church which, by the authority of Jesus Christ, that transferred this rest to the Sunday in

remembrance of the resurrection of our Lord,” Catholic press of Sydney, Australia, Aug. 25, 1900.

“The Catholic Church for over one thousand years before the existence of a Protestant, by virtue of her divine mission, changed the day from Saturday to Sunday,” The Catholic Mirror of Baltimore, Maryland, Sept. 2, 1893.

This is blasphemy, apostasy, and arrogance to the highest, all such wicked people that “loveth and maketh a lie.”(Rev 22:15) will be lost.
